




Artwork description:

Here, the figure stands, with hands tucked into pockets, oblivious to what is going on.

Artwork Description:

M'aider is a French word for help me, the phonetic equivalent for mayday which was conceived as a distress call by Frederick Stanley Mockford in the early 1920s. Here a figure dominates the lower space of the canvas with one eye rendered in realism, open and looking upwards. Soot serves as a halo. Since 2016, residents of the Niger Delta began to experience dark foggy skies with sentiments of black dust resting on surfaces; a direct consequence of artisanal refining of crude oil taking place. Several outcries and protests were met with little or corresponding government action. The painting serves as a cry for help
