Urevbu Contemporary Celebrates a Trio of Black Artists in Honor of Black History Month Opening February 5

Memphis, TN - February 1, 2022 - Urevbu Contemporary is pleased to announce its first exhibition of 2022 titled "Black Soliloquy" featuring a trio of emerging Black artists to watch from Ethiopia, Nigeria and the US. The exhibition launches with a private view for gallery collectors and other invited guests on Friday, February 4. The public opening reception will be held on Saturday, Feb 5 from 5:30pm - 7:30pm. Masks are required. The exhibition will be on view through February 28, 2022.

About the exhibition:

Black Soliloquy, is an exhibition of new paintings by three artists: Omari Booker, Jimmy Nwanne, and Birhane Worede. Like the dramatic device from which the exhibition draws its title, their paintings may be viewed through the lens of contemplative, introspective discourse. In applying paint to canvas, these artists give external expression to interior thoughts and construct images out of ideas. Opening during Black History Month, Black Soliloquy is a celebration of Black art across the globe, bringing together the work of a trio of artists from the United States, Nigeria, and Ethiopia. Deeply human, their figurative paintings reveal the diverse and rich spectrum of Black experiences and Black histories.

About the Artists:

Omari Booker

Omari Booker is a visual artist based in Los Angeles, CA and Nashville, TN. He learned his B.S. in Graphic Design from Tennessee State University. Painting in oil is Omari's predominant medium, but he also works in mixed media where charcoal, ink, and found objects are essential building blocks of his work. Large-scale work has been a constant creative outlet for Omari, and murals have also become a consistent part of his creative practice.
